Hence, Ukiyo-e became synonymous with “The Floating World”, the name given to the Yoshiwara (red light district of Tokyo). Ukiyo-e translates to “depiction of popular pleasures of town life”. The collection depicts actors performing various roles in everyday life in that world. Diane Genre is an expert on Asian Art and will discuss her collection of 24 prints on display.

The tour covers the history of the garden—including information about this Works Progress Administration-funded project. Lastly we will end our visit with a picnic lunch provided by Lambeth House. 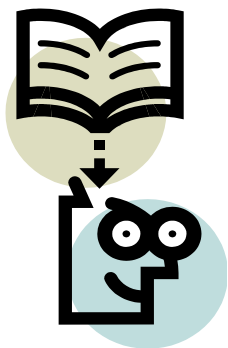
